FALLS Prevention

Patients who have had sedation can fall more easily and may need extra help or support while:

- walking
- going up and down stairs
- getting in and out of the car
- stepping up gutters
- going to the toilet

The risk of falling may be increased if the patient is:

- elderly
- has had a general anaesthetic



- There are hand hygiene stations located in the waiting room and throughout the facility.
- Please use the hand rub when you arrive and leave the facility and regularly during your time here.
- Good hand hygiene is essential to prevent the spread of infection.
